

The national gem of Tibet

5-6 Mohs Scale

One of the world's most ancient gems. Egyptian royality wore turquoise jewelery as early as 5500 BC.

The gems name comes from the French expression pierre tourques, of "Turkish stone".

Translucent to opaque, color ranges from light to medium blue or greenish blue, often mottled with veins of matrix throughout.

The color of turquoise was symbolic for "forget me not", it was used in many sentimental pieces during the victorian era.

Mined in many areas around the world, turquoise is found in association with copper, from which it gets it blue to green color.





High quality turqouise also known as Sleeping Beauty, Robins Egg, Bisbee, and Kingman,

Turquoise is a porous stone that can absorb lotions and perfume so care when wearing and cleaning is paramount.

Zircon





Colorless zircon was widely used as a diamond substitute.

Zircon comes in a wide array of colors.

Heat treatment that produces many of it's colors might also make it brittle.

The oldest known rock in the world is generally believed to be a zircon from Canada estimated at nearly 4 billion years old.

It is ironic that zircon can be found virtually worldwide, yet the gem is almost impossible to find at retail.
