





BONTOS How to draw a simple ring shape by Leah Harden-O-Brien







What's Opened in Orange County?

County order: Following state order

Face coverings: Following statewide order which requires people to wear face

coverings in public place and at essential businesses

Essential retail: Grocery stores, pharmacies, banks and post offices, etc. are open

Retail: Retailers reopened with modifications. Shopping malls closed

Restaurants: Indoor dine-in closed, but outdoor dining open and delivery/takeout

allowed

Bars: All bars, breweries and pubs closed, unless they offer sit-down outdoor dining. Indoor wineries and tasting rooms closed

Lifestyle: Golf courses, landscape gardening, pools, outdoor hair salons, outdoor barbershops, tanning facilities, car washes, pet grooming, hotels and outdoor nail

salons reopened

Parks: Most county parks and campgrounds reopened

Beaches: Open with modifications

Schools: Most K-12 schools are distance learning **Government:** Open only for essential functions

Houses of worship: All houses of worship closed indoors


WORK SHOD BITS & TIPS

COLLECTING ROUGH GEMSTONES ***





A while ago, Jim Burke borrowed to me some of SARM's earlier year newsletters. There was an article about SARM's field trip to the Wiley Well District collecting gemstone roughs. It was published in our Chips 'N Splinters in November, 1990. I thought to share this map with you.

In case you're wondering what they went for. Here is the directions to the collecting area, and what to collect.

Directions: Take Hwy 10 East toward Indio & Desert Center. The Wiley Well Off Ramp is 29 miles East of Desert Center. Take the Wiley Well Road south—it is a dirt road. SARM's camp was about 15 miles from Hwy 10.

What To Collect: Nodules, geodes, fire agate, common opal, sardonyx, barite, chalcedony, sagenite agate and thunder eggs. Lots of float material.
