

DRESIDENT'S MESSAGE





December Birthstone: TURQUOISE

Turquoise is a blue to green mineral that has been prized as a gemstone for thousands of years. It has a Mohs hardness of 5 to 6. The word turquoise is derived from the French turquoise which means "Turkish". This mineral was first brought to **Europe through Turkey.** Ancient Chinese carved turquoise 3000 years ago. This gemstone also play an important role in Native American arts and crafts. Some turquoise often contain spiderweb matrix or veining.

Turquoise Mountain

The area around Turquoise Mountain north of Halloran Springs has some rockhounding opportunities. There is the Yucca Mine which produces tale that occasionally has exceptional dendrite specimens. The Toltec Mine has turquoise. If these areas are not accessible, explore throughout these mountains for other materials.

Ludlow

The desert floor southeast of Ludlow has almost unlimited amounts of obsidian shards that can be collected. Native Americans used this material source to make arrowheads and other stone tools.
