# IF YOU LIKE LAPIS.....

117TH CONGRESS 1ST SESSION H.R. 5088

IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIES AUGUST 24, 2021

To prohibit the importation into, or transit through, the United States of any mineral, or product produced with minerals, from Afghanistan, and for other purposes.

SEC. 5. Statement of policy.

It is the policy of the United States to promote and facilitate the adoption by the international community of measures similar to the measures to prohibit the importation into, or transit through, the United States of minerals and products produced with minerals from Afghanistan as described in section 4 in order to prevent the funding of

terrorist activities by the Taliban.

This newly introduced bill may have effects on how often we will see some particular minerals at our local gem shows in the future. This bill contains eleven sections describing policy, enforcement, report and etc..

# **DECEMBER BIRTHSTONES** ~ Turquoise, Blue Topaz


Turquoise is the traditional birthstone for those who are born in December, and the gemstone of the 11th anniversary. It is a blue green hydrated phosphate of copper and aluminum. It is found only in few places, and it has a Mohs hardness of 5-6. Turquoise is a rare and valuable gemstone. Blue turquoise is rare and often sought after by collectors and jewelers. Bluish green and green turquoise are also preferred by many. Some turquoise contain part of the host rocks and present to have a matrix or a spider web appearance such as those from the Kingman Mine.

Blue topaz is the modern December birthstone. It is a silicate mineral of aluminum and fluorine, and it has a Mohs hardness of 8. The blue color is the result of heat treatments in the laboratory. Topaz are found from the earth pale blue or colorless. The vivid light blue color is created to add marketable values in this gemstone. Blue topaz is relatively inexpensive to obtain, and has a good wearability.


