

# WORK SHOP BITS & TIPS

## The workshop is open to all members the first full weekend of the month. Pam & Don Greene our Workshop Officers are flexible. Call (949) 548-0752 for alternate times if needed.

The Workshop is fully equipped with tools to make cabochons from start to finish, as well as a small kiln for dichotic glass work and also jigs for wire working. In addition, rough stones and materials are available for members to practice on.



These two books are from SARM library. Both books present quite a lot of information about jewelry making, tools, materials, and how to. They are also fun to read. If you are thinking of setting up a workbench, it is helpful to see the buying and using tools section in "Working with Copper, Silver and Enamel". We get a basic understanding of tools needed and the types of metal objects or jewelry we can create with these tools. This book shows its readers techniques of making a chain, a catch, rings, brooches, bracelets, and more.

If you like to design jewelry or to create something unique, "Jewelry Making and Design" is one of the books for you. It illustrates simple brooch patterns, how to design your own jewelry, and different stone setting techniques. If you like to make buckles, clasps, cuff links or cuff buttons, you can also find some helpful tips here.
