MAY BIRTHSTONE: EMERALD

Emerald is May's gemstone. It has a hexagonal crystal structure, and it belongs to the Beryl family (beryllium aluminum silicates). Members of the beryl family are Red Beryl, Aquamarine, Emerald, Helidor and others. They are distinguished by their colors. Emerald's green color derives from the trace amount of chromium or vanadium in its structure. The colors of emeralds can range from



dark green, medium green, light green, bluish green to blue colors. It has a Mohs hardness of 7.5 to 8. Natural emerald stones often contain inclusions such as tiny gas bubble or crystals. These inclusions are not considered as flaws or defects, but instead they are used to identify natural authentic emeralds. Emeralds like other gemstones are graded by their color, clarity, cut and carat weight. However, color and clarity are almost equally important in grading emeralds.



Synthetic emeralds have been produced by overgrowing emeralds on colorless beryl. The growth rate is about 1mm per month, and they do not have inclusions. Synthetic emeralds have the same chemical composition as the natural emeralds, but lack of rarity, details, color variations and saturation. They are less expensive than natural ones and can be detected by the eye alone.

WORK SHOP BITS & TIPS

The Workshop is fully equipped with tools to make cabochons from start to finish, as well as a small kiln for dichotic glass work and also jigs for wire working. In addition, rough stones and materials are available for members to practice on.
