The meeting adjourned at 9.00 PM



September birthstone is sapphire. This gemstone has a Mohs hardness of 9 which makes it one of the favorite stones for jewelry making. Sapphire is a tough stone without cleavage. It is safe to clean, easy to care for, and suitable for daily use. Warm soapy water is good to use for cleaning sapphire. Sapphire usually refers to the blue variety of corundum. The blue is the most popular color for sapphire. The red variety of corundum is commonly known as ruby. Sapphire is often heat treated to result a more clear or intense blue color. Sapphire is found in Kashmir, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Australia, US (Montana), and other countries in Asia and Africa.

Earlier this year I bought a Garrett AT Pro Metal Detector along with all of the accessories. I enjoyed going out detecting the 3 or 4 times, but I have been unable to find the time to use my metal detector and would like to sell it.

The Garrett AT Pro Metal Detector is a high quality metal detector with the ability to detect in almost any terrain, including underwater up to 10 feet. It is focused on finding coins and jewelry.

All of the Accessories Include:

A coil cover to protect the detecting coil. A Pro Pinpointer to Pinpoint exactly where in a hole your target is. A sand scoop for shoveling and sifting sand at the beach. A trowel with measurements to dig and see how deep your hole is. Metal Detecting Headphones that can be used to hear types of metal and locations. A metal detector carrying bag that can be used to travel long distances with the metal detector.

The Workshop is fully equipped with tools to make cabochons from start to finish, as well as a small kiln for dichroic glass work and also jigs for wire working. In addition, rough stones and materials are available for members to practice on.



Welcome to SARM Workshop! There are many lapidary templates available for members to use at the workshop. These templates help us to draw outlines on our rock slabs. Most popular shapes such as circles, ovals, triangles, and squares can be found in different dimensions on these templates. Whether you have a small piece of rock or a larger piece of slab, you can use these tools to help outline a shape you like. After drawing shapes on a rock slab, you can use a tile saw to cut and shape preform pieces for dopping. Please use earmuffs at the workshop to protect your ears from loud noise.
